Objectives

We want to improve outcomes for people with heart disease around Greater Manchester, and to reduce its impact on lives beyond current NHS provision. To this end, we intend to fund a wide range of projects.

All applications must demonstrate a close alignment with one or more of NW Hearts Charity's funding priorities, namely projects that benefit:

- * people living with heart disease (diagnosed or undiagnosed)
- * the family and carers of this group
- * the specialist staff who care for them
- * research into cardiac conditions

Eligibility

The application **must** demonstrate a strong connection to Greater Manchester (GM). The application should have an impact on one of the following:

- * people or communities who live in GM
- * organisations located in GM and their staff / volunteers

We welcome applications from colleagues in:

- *NHS primary, secondary and tertiary care
- *Community groups, CIC's, Registered Charities and other not-for-profit organisations
- *Research and educational establishments

If you are applying from a community group, CIC, registered charity or other not-for-profit-organisation, you **must** be able to describe your level of expertise in heart disease and/or your existing relationships with NHS services who have this expertise. If you are unsure whether you meet this criteria, please contact NW Hearts Charity prior to submitting an application.

If you are applying for research funding, the principal investigator must have a contract with either a UK research organisation and/or an NHS organisation.

Impact

It is likely that the following projects will be given greater priority:

- * projects that cost up to £10,000 (although projects with an upper limit of £25,000 may be considered)
- * projects that are likely to demonstrate short-term benefit (within 12 months).
- * projects that can demonstrate longevity of impact, beyond 12 months

Limitations

There are a selected number of things that we will not fund:

- * the delivery of services that are otherwise provided by the NHS
- * projects that do not align with our charitable objects and funding criteria (e.g. the arts, emergency relief etc).
- * individual benefit, unless they are staff members or involved in research / training related to cardiovascular disease.
- * costs associated with the purchase or maintenance of automated external defibrillators (other charitable sources exist for this)
- * costs of any sort already incurred

In general, we will not

- * 'top up' individual grants already awarded by another funder, unless such a grant has suddenly thrown up unexpected opportunity which could be leveraged
- * award grants either to private hospitals or to commercial organisations who contract healthcare services to the NHS, unless there is a significant benefit to the wider population.
